

Clinical Program Scholarships

The University of Kansas offers several scholarships to new graduate students. These scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis to students in program throughout the university. This year, the Clinical Program is pleased to offer two scholarships specifically for applicants to the clinical program:

Clinical Program Diversity Scholar

The Clinical Program Diversity Scholar is intended to increase the diversity of the clinical training program. The Scholar position provides a small supplemental summer stipend for up to two years for students in good standing. Application for the Scholar position consists of a short (e.g., one page essay) describing how the student believes he or she can contribute to the diversity of the program. Essays can be included with the student's application to the program, or can be sent separately to the Program Director at reingram@ku.edu.

The Edward A. Dreyfus Scholar

The Edward A. Dreyfus Scholar is funded by the Dr. Edward A. Dreyfus Endowment and is intended to help students who have had to overcome obstacles (e.g., low income) to be in a position to successfully apply to graduate school. The Dreyfus Scholar position provides a small supplemental summer stipend for a student who is in good standing in the program. Applicants who wish to apply for this scholarship should submit a brief essay on why they qualify. Essays can be included with the student's application to the program, or can be sent separately to the Program Director at reingram@ku.edu.
